**A** **Ruins of the Great East Japan Earthquake Sendai Arahama Elementary School**

Former elementary school building where 320 lives including that of children and local residents were saved from the tsunami that was triggered by the Great East Japan Earthquake. This facility is opened to the public to disseminate lessons learned from the disaster and memories of the local community.



**B** **Ruins of the Great East Japan Earthquake Residential Foundation, Arahama Area of Sendai City**

A facility that preserves housing foundations damaged by the tsunami. This facility shows the force of the tsunami and the daily life of residents before the disaster.



**C** **Monument "Arahama Memorial Bell"**

A monument built with the purpose of remembering Arahama and victims of the disaster



**D** **Monument "The Memories and History of the Arahama Area"**

A monument to pass down the memories and history of the Arahama area, which was devastated by the 2011 tsunami



**E** **Arahama Public Square & Evacuation Hill**

Public square for everyone. Space containing parking lots and public toilets that also includes an evacuation hill, which serves as a place of refuge during a tsunami.



**F** **Kaigan Park Center House**

General information facility of Kaigan Park. In addition to changing rooms, shower rooms and rental bicycles, this facility has halls that can be used for conducting training seminars.

**1** **JR Fruit Park Sendai Arahama**

Tourist orchards where seasonal fruits and vegetables can be picked year-round. There is also a cafe which serves dishes made using the fruits and vegetables grown in the orchard and a farmer's market. [Sendai Terminal Building Co., Ltd.]

**2** **East Coast Park**

Outdoor basketball courts that anyone can use for free at any time of the day. There are two basketball courts as well as a cafe and a gym for training. [Kimura Zoki Ltd.]

**3** **Garden Kitchen Umitokaze**

All-weather barbecue facility where one does not have to bring any tools. There is a cafe that is popular for its meat dishes, and rental farmland is available for those who want to try farming. [Tohoku Kuroswa Construction Industry Co., Ltd.]

**4** **Fukanuma Seaside Place**

An cross-generation interactive facility with activities for playing and learning. In addition to an inclusive design playground, there is a cafe where one can savor Hawaiian and Okinawan cuisines while enjoying the ocean breeze. [Konno Real Estate Co., Ltd.]

**5** **Prospect Field**

All-weather sports facility equipped with professional baseball measuring instrument. This facility has a pitching practice field and batting machines, and can be used for various other sports including futsal, or be used for field events. [Deelu Co., Ltd.]

**6** **Leisure Farm**

Communal farm for growing crops and a base for marine-sports experience. Aside from a communal farm that promotes interactions between people, surfing events, SUP (Stand-up Paddleboard) opportunities, fishing, and harvest festivals are held.
